Lojean Daniels departed this life peacefully on Saturday, January 16, 2021. She was born on October 17, 1939 to the union of Gene & Lodie (Peagler) Hunt in Greenville, Alabama. Lojean, affectionately called "Susie" or "Lo", relocated to Syracuse, NY after marriage in 1963.

Lojean began working as a Nursing Aide at Crouse-Irving Memorial Hospital. In 1975, when her children were 11, 9, 5 and 2 years old, she enrolled in the Practical Nurse Program at Central Technical High School in Syracuse. She earned her degree in 1979 and went on to work as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) at Van Duyn Home and Hospital. She worked at Van Duyn until she retired after twenty-six (26) years of service. Lojean was an excellent employee who always treated her patients like she would want to be treated - with kindness and respect.

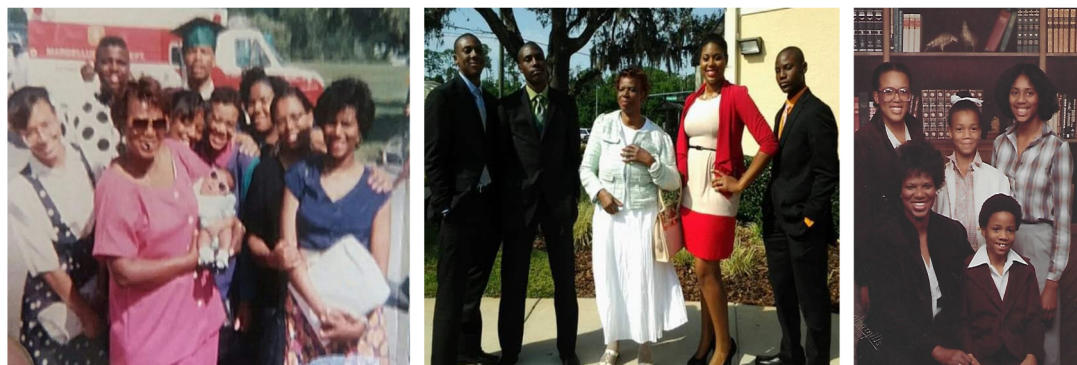
